MARY KINGS CLOSE

Hidden 'neath The Royal Mile is Edinburgh's most deep secret, a warren of hidden avenues & alleyways. Or as we say, closes, and wynds. Abandoned for many years its restoration has given light to Edinburghs' past.



JOHN KNOX HOUSE

Built from 1490 onwards, it belonged to a Walter Redpath, but 'thought' to have been the domicile of John Knox, a prominent Protestant reformer. What is known, is that Mary Queen of Scots' goldsmith, John Mossman lived here.



THE PEOPLES STORY

Originally a 16th Century prison, it has oral, audio histories, as well as the written word, sharing what it was like to live in Edinburgh throughout the Centuries. A visual step back in time that helps us realise the lives of those before us.



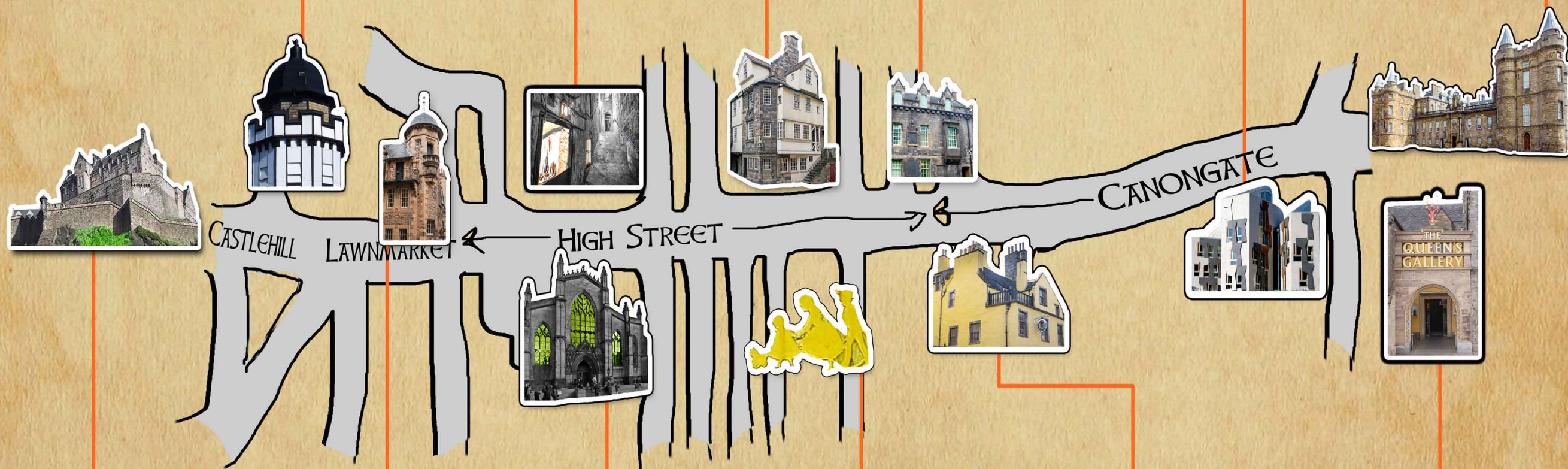
SCOTTISH PARLIAMENT

HOLLYROOD HOUSE

Serving as the principal Royal residence in Edinburgh, it was built during the 16th Century. As a national treasure it's open to the public all year round, except when a member of the Royal family is in residence.

WRITERS MUSEUM

Three of Scotlands most famous writers are eloquently lauded, shared, and displayed within these very walls. Robert Burns, Sir Walter Scott, & Robert Louis Stevenson, along with many other Scottishwriters.



ST GILES

St. Giles Cathedral, with its' famed crown spire rises out of the cobbles, commands attention, and is resplendant with religious iconography, as well as truly beautiful stained glass windows. Being in this space can create a sense of calm.



MUSEUM OF CHILDHOOD

Originally the work of Patrick Murray, the eclectic collection of childrens toys dates back to 1908. A passionate collector he created the worlds first museum to specialise in the history of childhood, with well over 250,00 visitors a year!



MUSEUM OF EDINBURGH

Tracing the history of the capitol, from its' prehistoric roots, it's full of artefacts that illustrate the developement of the city, with original plans for the New Town drawn by James Craig. It also shares a bit of what life was like in the past!



QUEENS GALLERY

Opening in 2002, it provides a purpose built, state of the art facility, to enable a program of changing exhibitions from delicate works of art to the more robust. Part of the mainbuilding, the gallery is open to the public, all year round!
